In order to preserve the kind of setting where the memory of loved ones can be treasured, everyone is asked to adhere to a few basic Cemetery Regulations.



In the centre of cemetery there is a beautiful Chapel, which is available for use during funerals. The exterior of the chapel is illuminated with twinkling commemorative lights each Christmas.



The cemetery is open for new burials; although Councillors are currently considering a project to extend the area available for new graves because it already contains over 2000 burials and cremated remains.

Henley Road Cemetery opened in 1914. Hand written records are held at the Town Council offices and are available to view by request Mon-Fri 9:30-4pm.

Finding a Grave

Layout:

The cemetery is made up of 17 areas, divided by paths, which include an area dedicated to Catholic burials, two cremated remains plots; and the Babies Memorial Area, which is commemorated by a hand carved stone memorial.

For further information regarding hiring the chapel, purchasing a grave, erecting a memorial or locating an old family grave, please contact Cemetery Officer 01584 871 970. If you are trying to find a grave in the cemetery you are able to request information from Ludlow Town Council, which you will receive Grave Plot/ Row/ Grave Number.

The Grave plots are listed A-L which would indicate one of the areas divided by the paths which your grave will be in. The graves themselves are set out in rows that are numbered at the end of each of the rows. Once you have found the row you will need to look along it to find the specific grave number, which is usually inscribed on the bottom at the back of the headstone. These are in ascending or descending order depending which side of the row you look from. There are almost 2400 grave plots in the cemetery, so first finding the plot and the row number will make your search easier.





Toilets

The lawn is maintained by the grounds keepers at Ludlow Town Council who work tirelessly to maintain the cemetery to a very high standard. They are very approachable, often found on the cemetery grounds they are always happy to lend assistance. We do however ask that visitors to the cemetery be respectful and help us to maintain the cemetery to such a high standard by picking up all rubbish and dead flowers and disposing them in the refuse bins situated around the cemetery. These are shown on the map above.

Newly disturbed ground could continue to settle for approximately six months. Our Grounds keepers continually monitor and if needed top up the graves with soil, however graves can spontaneously unsettle. If this occurs and the grave has sunk please notify one of the grounds keepers or the Town Council in order for us to top it up.

Water Provision for flowers

There are taps situated by the chapel and car park entrance for use by visitors to water flowers. Bottles are provided by the taps to be used to collect the water.

Water is for flowers only not for drinking.

Wildlife



Surrounded by fields and woodland there is a wide variety of species present in and around Ludlow and links through the town form important highways for wildlife to pass through the town. The cemetery is a green space that helps to form part of one of these green links keeping the wildlife safely off the urban environment and off busy roads.

The cemetery and its surrounding boundary also contain many different species habitats, such as birds, bats, mammals and insects. Green areas like this are vital in keeping the ecology of the area at a high level.
