If the Burial is under the BURIAL LAWS AMENDMENT ACT, 1880, this Certificate must be delivered to "the Relative, Friend, or Legal Representative of the deceased, having the charge of or being responsible for the Burial."

If the body is to be CREMATED (Cremation Act, 1902), the Certificate must be delivered to the Medical Referee of the Crematorium at which the Cremation is to take place.

IN ALL OTHER CASES the Certificate must be delivered to the Minister or other person who buries or performs any Funeral or Religious Service for the Burial of the dead body.*

* After the Burial the Certificate should be delivered to, and preserved by, the Authority of the Burial Ground.
