LUDLOW TOWN PLAN We began by listening to a wide range of local people and groups, and were able to learn a great deal from our consultations held in March and April 2010.

Ludlow Town Council will work in partnership with Shropshire Council to achieve the best for Ludlow. Where it can Ludlow Town Council will directly fund or influence initiatives to improve:

Tourism by publishing a Calendar of Events Leaflet; advertising Park & Ride; work to establish additional toilet facilities; and install additional useful signage.

Transport: by lobbying and consulting with Shropshire Council

Town Centre: act of a coordinating body for activities; seek funding to appoint a Town Centre Manager; work with Shropshire Council and local organisations to maintain architectural heritage of Ludlow and use role as a statutory planning consultee to seek more effective use of accommodation above shops; make representations to achieve the best parking solutions

Environment: Continue policy of using LED Christmas lights; conversion of street lighting to low energy use

Youth: Continue provision of play areas; seek to improve facilities; start publication of Youth Events Bulletin; host initial meeting to explore setting up a Youth Network.

Leisure: Support the Assembly Rooms and Leisure Centre; promote festival and special events in Buttercross Bulletin and website

Services for Residents: Support building of new hospital facilities; continue policy of maintenance and care at Henley Road Cemetery; continue to maintain castle Garden, Garden of Rest, Wheeler Road Skate Park; and develop The Linney.

Serves for the Elderly: To provide info via Buttercross Bulletin Newsletter; to liaise with other organisations

Affordable housing: Make representation in support Shropshire Council policy for 35% of developer built houses to be 'local affordable'
