

Services Committee Projects

Ludlow Town Council's share of your Council Tax bill this year will increase by 7.1%. This is to fund some one-off urgent projects, for which we are also applying for grants.



The Buttercross, a Grade 1 Listing Building owned by the Council, needs major repairs. Phase One is urgent work on the cupola.



Sections of the retaining wall in Dinham Gardens are collapsing and damaging the fence. Repair work is clearly needed.



The Henley Road Cemetery, which is operated by the Town Council, includes a chapel and a toilet block.

Long-standing drainage problems need to be addressed in two areas of the cemetery, sections E and F in the plan reproduced above. This will involve groundworks.

The Cemetery chapel needs a door refitting and the external woodwork needs some minor repairs and to be painted.

The Cemetery toilets need refurbishing.

New Lifebuoy

Cllr Taylor-Smith, acting at the request of residents of his Gallows Bank Ward, has led Ludlow Town Council's successful efforts to install a lifebuoy along Temeside.

As Cllr Taylor-Smith points out, "There was a clear need for a lifebuoy. I have been approached by a number of residents, including the wife of the gentleman who was rescued from drowning by improvised use of a garden hose."

The Town Council has agreed to look after the new Lifebuoy and has arranged to include it on the Council's insurance policy. The Direct Labour Force will also keep an eye on it, checking the equipment periodically.

The equipment was purchased with the help of grant funds provided by the Ludlow Joint Committee, which will be a forum for local views when the new Shropshire Council comes into being on 1st April.
