#### R/89 LUDLOW'S UNITARY COUNCILLORS QUESTION AND ANSWER SESSION

#### Andy Boddington, Ludlow North

Councillor Boddington said that he welcomed Councillor Shewards paper and urged the Town Council to work on a Neighbourhood Plan. He stated that although SamDev would partially reached this goal, the Neighbourhood plan would give the Town greater protection under the Localism Bill. Councillor Boddington added that there were still real concerns that Shropshire would continue to meet the five year supply of housing.

#### Viv Parry, Ludlow South

Councillor Parry explained that she had requested the double yellow lines on Sheet Road in response to the report of an incident in Kennet Bank, where an ambulance had had problems exiting onto Sheet Road. She added Shropshire Council had carried out a consultation and stated that vehicle activated signs (VAS) may be available to deter speeding vehicles.

### R/99 NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

The Chair asked the Town Clerk to explain the function of the Neighbourhood Plan. The Town Clerk explained that the Neighbourhood Plan had a statutory status and was a community led group who identified a particular area and what would be important for the Town. She emphasised that local communities could be involved and that it needed a 50% sign off by referendum to come into practice. Having a Neighbourhood Plan would put Ludlow into a stronger position in the future. She stated that housing was a good start for discussion for the Neighbourhood Plan, in which views of other groups could be invited, such as the Civic Society and Ludlow Town Residents Association.

The Chair suggested that a specific set of standard questions were drawn together which could be circulated to all Estate Agents in the area. In light of the Bank of England indicating that it was inevitable that interest rates were going to rise Ludlow could be in a position where it had a bank of housing stock which no-one could afford.

Councillor Smithers agreed with the Chair, pointing out that the Town Council currently had a Town Plan, which already addressed some issues including housing and transport.

The Chair reminded the Committee that one of the remits of the Neighbourhood Plan was that it could recommend the type of houses that Ludlow required and

all organisations and residents views could be included via consultation.

Councillor Draper asked that Councillor Sheward was thanked for his report.

- ii) the Town Council set up an initial Neighbour Plan meeting to further discuss planning issues specific to the future growth of Ludlow with the Civic Society and other organisations.

## R/100 PROPOSED DOUBLE YELLOW LINES, SHEET ROAD

The Chair explained the report and also drew the Committee's attention to the email attachment from the Senior Traffic Engineer at Shropshire Council. He then invited the Committee's comments.

Councillor Gill stated that he was not in favour of either erecting signs, which he felt would be ignored or painting double yellow lines. He went on to say that residents needed somewhere to park their cars if they did not have a driveway and that if double yellow lines were imposed then the problem would be moved onto another area of the Town. Councillor Gill added that parked vehicles naturally calmed traffic and if parking was prohibited this would increase speeding.

Councillor Draper agreed with Councillor Gill and informed the Committee that there was a trend on Facebook for youths to record their speeds using Vehicle Activated Signs.

Councillor Smithers commented that speeding was a perennial problem which in his opinion would be resolved with mobile speed cameras.

### 7.40 pm Councillor Perks entered the meeting

Following a question from the Chair Councillor Parry confirmed that the speed limit on Sheet Road was previously 40mph but that it was currently 30mph.

Councillor Sheward commented that whilst he was against double yellow lines being introduced on Sheet Road he stated that Kennet Bank had its own challenges being narrow, it's gradient and lack of turning.

Following permission from the Chair, Councillor Perks added that although the Police were in favour of engineered solutions they were in favour of parked cars which calmed traffic.
