# R/277 Ludford Bridge Closure

#### <u>RESOLVED</u> (unanimous) MC/TG

Members expressed serious concerns regarding the length of time Ludford Bridge would be closed, and requested that Shropshire Council carry out a full structural report on the bridge and if this deems the bridge safe then:

- i) That Ludford Bridge should be open as soon as possible.
- ii) To request that Shropshire Council explore alternatives to the current closure and undertake a structure survey to ascertain if the bridge could be opened to vehicles under 3.5 tonnes.
- iii) If the bridge is structurally sound to carry vehicles under 3.5 tonnes, Shropshire Council installs weight restriction signage and secures the area damaged with fixed rails so that the bridge could be opened to light vehicles.

# R/278 Ludford Bridge- Traffic Lights

#### RESOLVED (5:0:2) MC/MJ

That during the closure of Ludford Bridge members were in agreement with Shropshire Council that the safest option was to turn off all of the 3 way traffic lights.

## R/279 Road closure Signage on A49 South Approach

- i) That the new signage (on the South approach into Ludlow off the A49) is insufficient and traffic including articulated lorries were still trying to access the town centre via Ludford Bridge.
- ii) That improved signage is urgently needed to state that there is 'No Access to the Town Centre via Ludford Bridge' and 'Access Only' to The Charlton Arms, Ludford, Overton Grange Hotel, Overton Service Station, Ludlow Cattle Market, Ludlow Touring Park and Whitcliffe Common.
- ii) That a clearly marked diversion route was also required to send out the message that Ludlow was open for business.

That the Town Clerk write to Shropshire Council and reiterate the comments made on 10<sup>th</sup> June 2016 by the Representational Committee.

#### R/29 15/01472/FUL Henley Hall Solar Farm

Councillor Draper thanked the Unitary Councillors and Mr Middleton for their comments on the Henley Hall Solar Farm. Councillor Draper was of the opinion that the land would be of greater benefit to the community for recreational

purposes and to the maintain the thriving wildlife in the area as damage to hedgerows, trees and ponds would take many years to re establish themselves.

Councillor Draper referred to the following comment from Tim Dobson CEO of Switch 2 Renewable, "that the company says around two thirds of the energy created by the site at Red Lodge is lost when it's transported.

*Tim Dobson, from Switch 2 Renewable, says that means it's not producing enough electricity to be useful to the National Grid".* 

Councillor Draper referred to the following statements from the National Policy and Planning Framework 2012;

Para 115: Great weight should be given to conserving landscape and scenic beauty in National Parks, the Broads and Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty, which have the highest status of protection in relation to landscape and scenic beauty. The conservation of wildlife and cultural heritage are important considerations in all these areas, and should be given great weight in National Parks and the Broads.

Para 128: In determining applications, local planning authorities should require an applicant to describe the significance of any heritage assets affected, including any contribution made by their setting. The level of detail should be proportionate to the assets' importance and no more than is sufficient to understand the potential impact of the proposal on their significance. As a minimum the relevant historic environment record should have been consulted and the heritage assets assessed using appropriate expertise where necessary. Where a site on which development is proposed includes or has the potential to include heritage assets with archaeological interest, local planning authorities should require developers to submit an appropriate desk-based assessment and, where necessary, a field evaluation.

Councillor Sheward raised his concerns about tonights meeting and the committees ability and expertise to comment and object to this application. He also agreed with the comments made on the visual impact and the effects on recreation and tourism.

#### RESOLVED (3:0:1) RS/TG

Object: LTC members agreed on the following points:

- The site was unsuitable
- The detrimental effect on the countryside, recreation, the visual aspect and the wildlife.
- The Paragraphs 115 and 128 of the National Policy and Planning Framework supported members concerns.
