R/394 PUBLIC OPEN SESSION (15 minutes)

There were 5 members of the public present.

Daphne Jones, Castle View Terrace, Ludlow

Ms Jones is Chair of Friends of Whitcliffe Common and stated that the proposed works including the felling of tree 8 & 9 was supported by Shropshire Wildlife Trust and were in line with the Friends aims and objectives to open up views of Ludlow.

Daphne read out a range of opinion for and against the tree works to the oaks and stated that the works had previous been considered and declined in 2013, although new members appeared to join solely to vote on this issue and then not continue to support the Friends further. She said that whilst the trees were healthy and good specimens, they were not unique on Whitcliffe, and it was the opinion of the Friends that, in this case, the preservation of the view is more important for Ludlow. She that the whole common was rich in diverse wildlife habitats and the two circumstances under which trees would be felled on Whitcliffe, namely to protect a view and in the interests of health and safety.

Harvey Griffiths, Sandpits Road, Ludlow

Mr Griffiths said he supported Ms Jones comments and wished members to know that the friends had planted over 1340 new trees on the common many of which were oak trees.

Mr Gareth Thomas, member of Friends of Whtcliffe common

Mr Thomas said he objected to the two oak trees (8&9 on the plan) being felled to protect the view. He said that the proposed works were opposed in 2013 and he felt that this decision should stand. He stated that the trees were healthy and he would consider felling them to be an act of vandalism. He felt that wildlife habitat should be the primary concern of Shropshire Wildlife Trust.

R/395 <u>LUDLOW'S UNITARY COUNCILLORS QUESTION AND ANSWER SESSION</u>

There was one Unitary Councillor present.

Cllr Boddington was asked for his comments regarding Stone House, Fishmore & Foldgate Lane & the tree works on Whitcliffe.

Re: Stone House - He said he had no objection to the principle of a development on the site, but still had heritage issue with the proposed designs.

Re: Fishmore – He stated that outline permission already exists and the developer has stated that they will be selling the site on to another developer. In Cllr Boddington's opinion they are establishing the principles of development for a scheme that would be relevant to the needs of Ludlow, but there is no guarantee that a new developer would adopt those principles.

Re: Foldgate Lane – He said the appeal will most likely take place on 2-5 August and three days in September. The establishment of the 5yr land supply

argument would be a time consuming element of the proceedings. He also confirm that Shropshire Council had employed the services of a barrister and would be defending the case.

Re: Tree Works on Whitcliffe – the majority of the works were for maintenance and should take place, but Cllr Boddington confirmed that he had already objected to the felling of the oak trees identified as trees 8&9 on the plans.

Cllr Sheward queried that position of the tree line between castle View Terrace and the Fishmore development and stated that he had been informed that there was an ancient medieval hedge along this boundary. Cllr Boddington said that the ancient hedge would need to be investigated and the tree line had yet to be defined in the development.

R/397 SEVERN RIVERS TRUST- PRESENTATION

Mr Michael Morris made a presentation and answered member's questions. He confirmed that the land had been offered free of charge to the Trust and for this reason they were exploring the possibility of a riverside centre, which could be their HQ, with a meeting room and educational facilities. He said parking on site was limited and there would only be essential parking – most likely two disabled bays and two mini bus bays for schools.

He explained that the Riverside centre was part of a much larger HLF bid and the bid would continue even if the Riverside centre option was not taken up. He continued to explain that the site was suitable because of all the other riverside existing elements such as the eel traps that could be used for scientific monitoring, the SSSI status, the weirs, the fish pass and the riverside platforms.

The Chairman thanked Mr Morris for the presentation and wished the Severn Rivers Trust well in their work and stated that the town council were in agreement with the principles of the scheme and would welcomed the formal application for a project that could be beneficial for the River Teme and Ludlow.
