Tribute To Councillor O'Neill



Ludlow Town Council is deeply saddened by the news that Councillor Sean O'Neill passed away suddenly on Tuesday 6th February 2024.

Councillor O'Neill was a valued member of the

Town Council since joining in June 2017. During his two terms in office, he played an active part in the town's civic life.

He held the post of Vice Chair of Policy and Finance and Committee while serving as a Councillor. He also supported the work of Representational Committee, Services Committee, and Climate Action Sub Committee. His commitment to the Council did not waiver during recent periods of ill-health.

In the coming days, Ludlow Town Council will honour the service of Councillor O'Neill. The town flag will be flown at half-mast and Councillors will do all they can to support his family at this difficult time.

Installation Of Signage

We're delighted to have our historical 'Ludlow Museum' sign reinstalled outside the Museum under the archway. The sign will guide and welcome visitors to Ludlow Museum.

Simultaneously, the installation of the King's coronation plaque has been granted and installed in the Buttercross.

Budget

The budget in 2024 / 25 is an annual increase in council tax of £13.02 per year, which is an increase of 25p per week.

Ludlow Town Council set its budget following the guiding principles:

- To safeguard local services.
- To be mindful of the detrimental economic impact of the financial crisis.
- To set a sustainable budget for 2024/ 25.
- To set a reasonable and workable timetable to facilitate the projects.
- To set a budget trajectory for financial sustainability and resilience.

Boundary Review

Shropshire Council are holding a consultation to consider the Parish Boundaries for Ludlow and Ludford parishes. The area to be included in the review is the whole of the parishes of Ludlow and Ludford.

Summary of changes recommended by Ludlow Town Council:

- That newly created Rockgreen Ward becomes part of Ludlow Town Council's Hayton Ward.
- Ludlow Town Council expands to include the housing and commercial development land, and the park and ride in the newly created Sheet Ward.
- Ludford is recognised as an important historic area and a smaller parish is retained.

E. Walters Trouser Factory: A legacy remembered Exhibition

The exhibit pays homage to the remarkable journey of the E. Walters Trouser Factory, once the largest employer in Ludlow. The factory which was established by Ed Walters in 1957 shaped Ludlow's identity for decades.

The exhibition aims to celebrate the contributions of Ed Walters and his production legacy. We hope the exhibition will be a poignant opportunity for residents to reminisce and remember those who worked at the factory. The exhibition will open from Thursday 8th February until April 2024

Ludlow May Fair has been an integral part of Ludlow's culture, and this year marks the 50th anniversary since the Wynn family took over the annual May Fair celebrations.


The May Fair exhibition will open From April- June 2024.
