We are a not for profit community interest Company whose surplus goes into educational activities for young people.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 This report is to update members on information relating to our three equipped play areas at Linney Riverside Park, Wheeler Road play area/skate park, and Housman play area.

2. RECOMMENDATION

2.1 To note the findings of the reports and work to be completed.

3. BACKGROUND

3.1 Routine play area inspections are undertaken weekly by a qualified member of staff to ensure the play equipment and site is safe for use.

3.2 Annual independent play area inspections are also undertaken in Autumn every year. This is a health and safety requirement.

4. ANNUAL INSPECTION REPORTS

4.1 The annual inspections took place on 3rd November 2025 and the full reports were brought to Services Committee in November 2025.

4.2 A full list of issues, and associated actions, is shown in Appendix 1.

5. NEXT STEPS

5.1 Low priority work that has little or no expenditure (less than £100) will be completed as part of a schedule of work by the DLF.

Larger jobs, along with those which require quotes from the manufacturer, will come back to Services Committee for consideration in April 2026 along with details of suggested budget expenditure.

PRIDE OF PLACE LITTERPICKING

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Ludlow Pride of Place scheme was established in 2005 with the objective of making Ludlow a tidier place and to encourage civic pride in the town.
- 1.2 In October 2025 Ludlow Town Council confirmed we would support the co-ordination of monthly Saturday litterpicks beginning in January 2026.

2. RECOMMENDATION

- 2.1 To note the arrangements made for the first litterpick on Saturday 17th January 2026.
- 2.2 To consider the purchase of hi-vis vests for volunteers.

3. PRIDE OF PLACE LITTERPICKS

- 3.1 Pride of Place litterpicks will be co-ordinated by Ludlow Town Council from January 2026 and the following dates have been set for the coming year:

17 th January	18 th July
21 st February	15 th August
21 st March	19 th September
18 th April	17 th October
16 th May	21 st November
20 th June	19 th December

- 3.2 The litterpicks are predominantly organised by the Deputy Town Clerk with assistance from the Mayor, Cllr Lyle, who has been a longstanding supporter and volunteer with the Pride of Place.
- 3.3 All Pride of Place volunteers have been contacted and informed of the changes

4. PUBLICISING THE LITTERPICKS

- 4.1 The poster produced by the Communications & Marketing Officer is shown in Appendix 1.
- 4.2 Dates will be displayed locally on public noticeboards, including at the library, on social media pages and the Town Council website.

5. PURCHASE OF PERSONALISED HI-VIS VESTS

- 5.1 A small amount of equipment and a couple of green vests were passed over by the previous organiser.

It would be great to have some new hi-vis vests with 'Ludlow Pride of Place volunteer' printed on the back ready to start this new chapter. Hi-vis vests are also better than the previously used green as volunteers are working near to roadsides and it is important they are visible.

We currently have 10 volunteers and therefore if we could purchase 20 vests that would be sufficient for a few years.

- 5.2 A quote from Go Custom clothing (Ludlow based) for yellow hi-vis vests with 'Ludlow Pride of Place volunteer' printed on the back – lettering to be black. **These vests are important for volunteers working adjacent to roads.**
The cost is £ 6.51 each + vat and the print design set-up is a one-off cost at £ 5.00 + vat.
- 5.3 Other equipment such as litter pickers, hoops and waste bags will be provided by Shropshire Council.

6. BUDGET

- 6.1 Total cost for the personalised vests would be £135.20 + VAT.
- 6.2 It was agreed from the October meeting that Ludlow Town Council has a Climate Action budget that could be used for the purchase of any equipment needed. There is an annual budget of £860 and last years expenditure was £140.00.

An annual expenditure of up to £200 was anticipated to replace broken equipment and purchase sacks.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Ludlow History Festival is a new event for Ludlow and is planned to launch in August 2026.

2. RECOMMENDATION

2.1 To approve the request on the basis that it is subject to risk assessments and consent of specific details by the Town Clerk.

3. INITIAL EMAIL

3.1 Initial email received as below:

*Re: Ludlow History Festival
21 – 31 August, 2026*

This is a new festival which I'm hoping will encourage residents to explore and appreciate where they live more than they already do and visitors to come to Ludlow.

It is a not for profit making festival with collaboration from various groups within the town including the Civic Society, Town Walls Trust, Ludlow Castle, St Laurence's Church and Teme Valley Arts Society.

One of our ideas is for Anne Pitt to run workshops encouraging children and adults to design shields for the town inspired by Ludlow's Heraldic Roll. They would be printed onto correx paid for by the Teme Valley Arts Society. I anticipate them being 90 x 60 cm at their tallest and widest point.

I am writing to ask permission to install the shields on lamp posts around the town from the beginning of July onwards. They would be high up, eye catching and start generating conversation about why they are there. I'm hoping the festival will become an annual event and the shields can be utilised again.

4. POINTS TO NOTE

4.1 The organiser must provide a written risk assessment in advance which is to be approved by the Town Clerk.

DLF staff will need to be present during the installation/removal process to ensure electrical supplies etc are not affected.

The banners / shields will remain the responsibility of the event organiser for the duration of installation.

The organiser must arrange both the installation and removal after the event, to be undertaken on non market days.

5. BUDGET

4.1 No expenditure will be required by Ludlow Town Council.

SUMMER BUNTING OF MARKET AND EVENT SQUARES



SUMMER BUNTING FOR MARKET AND EVENT SQUARES

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 In October 2025 Services Committee approved that hanging floral baskets will no longer be displayed in the Market and Event Square's for health and safety reasons.
- 1.2 It was suggested that bunting could be erected in these areas to provide colour and vibrancy over the summer months to ensure the market area is welcoming and colourful.

2. RECOMMENDATION

- 2.1 To consider the options for summer bunting in the market area

3. INITIAL IDEA

- 3.1 To install bunting in 2026 from early May (immediately after the May Fair) to late September.

In the absence of the previously used hanging baskets this will provide an attractive appearance to the market area and brighten the area up on gloomy days.

4. HEALTH AND SAFETY

- 4.1 The bunting will be hung between LTC owned street lights and staff will use a cherry picker to reach the correct height.

The condition of the bunting will be monitored during the installation period for signs of damage (due to weather or vandalism).

5. BUNTING OPTIONS

5.1 Fabric/ cotton bunting would be the most sustainable and hopefully reuseable for a couple of years.

£34.20 (incl VAT) for 25m, knitted polyester, 60 flags per 25m section, flags 20x30cm
Pink, green, red, orange, white, blue, turquoise and purple
Flags are sown onto polypropylene tape
Total cost £342.00

5.2 Plastic bunting is unlikely to be used more than once and may not last the duration of the summer.

a) Flags and Flagpoles: Multi-coloured polyflex bunting

£11.99 for 10m (reduced costs for more bought), 24 flags per 10 section, flags 20x29cm
Red, white, blue, green, orange and yellow.
Total cost £136.25

b) Fun Party Supplies: Rainbow plastic bunting

£3.29 for 10m, plastic, flags are 30cm long
Total cost £82.25
Concerns regarding durability and quality of the bunting

6. AVAILABLE BUDGET

6.1 As the bunting is to replace historical planting the amenities planting budget (410/4303) could be used and has an available budget of £2,678.00.

Alternatively the street furniture maintenance budget (302/4222) has an available budget of £747.00, and the remaining £3 could come from contingencies.

CCTV IN LUDLOW



CCTV STATUS UPDATE

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 An upgrade to Ludlow's CCTV system has been in process since 2020.

For various reasons some aspects of the CCTV installation was delayed until recently.

2. RECOMMENDATION

2.1 To note the updated information regarding CCTV in the town.

3. CCTV LOCATIONS IN LUDLOW

3.1 Previous CCTV locations

Cameras are located at the following sites:

- Station Drive (opposite the doctors surgery) – Fixed camera
- Station Drive at the junction with Upper Galdeford & Gravel Hill – Fixed camera
- Tower Street at junction with Galdeford – Fixed camera
- Bull Ring – Fixed camera
- King Street (Hope House) - Fixed camera
- Broad Street (by Broad Bean) - Fixed camera
- Castle Square (by Vision Express) - Fixed and PTZ camera
- Event Square (by Ludlow College) - Fixed and PTZ camera

Radio transmitters are located at the following sites:

- Springfield Close (to link to the police station)
- Upper Galdeford (at the Thai bar)
- In the Buttercross (transmitters on roof)
- King Street

PTZ stands for Pan Tilt Zoom.

3.2 New CCTV locations

Cameras are installed at the following sites and the software is being updated:

- Station Drive near Aldi – 360 degree camera
- Corve Street at junction with Station Drive – 360 degree camera
- Corve Street near The Compasses – 360 degree camera
- Whitbread Road at junction with Sandpits Road (opposite park entrance) – 360 degree camera and anti-vandal spikes
- Bromfield Road near the Coronation Avenue junction – ANPR camera and Overview camera
- Henley Road towards Weyman Road junction – ANPR camera and overview camera
- Sheet Road by petrol station pedestrian crossing – ANPR camera and overview camera
- Lower Broad Street near Ludford bridge lights – ANPR camera and overview camera
- Event Square opposite Castle Lodge Buttery – ANPR camera and overview camera

The cameras are principally located on street lights with approval from Shropshire Council.

3.3 Upcoming CCTV locations

Cameras will shortly be located at the following sites:

- Ludlow library (Parkway and entrance side of building) – PTZ camera
- Henley Road by the mini roundabout with Gravel Hill and New Road – Fixed camera and link
- Fishmore Road by the mini roundabout with Raglan Place and Whitbatch Close – ANPR camera and overview camera

4. TRANSMITTER INSTALLATION AT ST LAURENCES CHURCH

4.1 After much communication and collaboration between electricians, the CCTV provider (ORP) and St Laurences Church the transmitting equipment was successfully installed on 22nd and 23rd October.

5. WORKS TO BE COMPLETED IMMIMENTLY

5.1 ORP attended Ludlow on Tuesday 18th Nov to service cameras and update software, however, had to cut their visit short due to a faulty alternator in the MEWP.

We are awaiting a revised date for this work and for installation dates of the last three items of equipment.

5.2 The revised date for the works was Thursday 8th January 2026 and we are awaiting an update from ORP regarding what work was completed and

whether the system installation is now complete.
