

Through the Blue Door – our staff

Ludlow Town Council employs nine permanent members of staff and extra seasonal staff from April to October. Here's an outline of who does what, which should help you contact the right person in the Council – 01584 878437.

TOWN CLERK and RESPONSIBLE FINANCIAL OFFICER Linda A Thomas

Linda was appointed Town Clerk of Ludlow in March 2008. Before coming to Ludlow, she was Town Clerk of Knutsford, Cheshire. She has overall responsibility for managing Council affairs, and specific responsibility for Full Town Council and Policy & Finance committee meetings.

ASSISTANT CLERK - Hannah Coleman

Hannah has worked for the Town Council since 2001, and is currently working towards a Certificate in Local Council Administration (CiLCA). Hannah was promoted to Assistant Clerk in 2007, and she deputises for Linda in the absence of the Town Clerk. She has specific responsibility for the Services and Highways & Parking committees.

COMMUNITY SERVICES OFFICER – Richard Harpur

Dick has worked as Community Services Officer since 2003. His main duties include managing the Direct Labour Force and the Town Council Amenity Areas. His role also includes Health & Safety; managing Cemetery administration and contracts such as streetlight maintenance, as well as assisting the Town Clerk with project development.

MARKET MANAGER - Roy Guestford

Roy has been organising and managing the day-to-day running of Ludlow Market since 2001. He also advises buskers on street licensing on Town Council Sites in Ludlow. He works closely with all market traders to ensure a wide variety of goods are displayed for sale, and organises special markets as well as the regular markets.

ADMIN ASSISTANT – Gina Wilding

Gina services the Representational Committee, the Christmas Lights Working Group, and the Web and Newsletter Working Group. She is the first point of contact at the Buttercross, sitting at the reception desk and administering cemetery records, the





FINANCE ASSISTANT Ann Shaughnessy

Ann maintains the Town Council's financial records and looks after the accounts for all aspects of Town Council's activities including markets, amenities, cemetery, and grant applications. She services the Accounts Sub-Committee, prepares payments and also administers the Council payroll.



Established in Spring 2006, Ludlow Town Council's Direct Labour Force (DLF) is based at Henley Road, and carries out the maintenance and regular inspections of the Cemetery, amenity areas, and other property owned and maintained by Town Council. The team also helps to maintain the market area in the centre of town and looks after Council machinery and vehicles. The DLF currently consists of three full time staff and two seasonal staff.

SUPERVISOR Stephen Gregory

Steven has worked on the DLF since its inception, and was promoted to Supervisor in 2007. He has previously worked as a contractor in landscaping and grounds maintenance.

ASSISTANT GROUNDSPERSON Sean Turgoose

Sean has also been a member of the DLF since its inception. He has twenty-four years horticultural experience and also acts as Market Assistant when required.

ASSISTANT GROUNDPERSON Nick Wilson

Nick, who joined the DLF in April 2008, is the newest member of the team.

SEASONAL STAFF

Are employed between April and October to assist the DLF during the busy season, and to run the boats at the Linney.

Ludlow in Bloom: Gold for 09?

"Ludlow in Bloom is organised and run by a committee that is not part of the Town Council, but we work closely together," explains Cllr Jim Smithers who chairs Ludlow In Bloom.

The Council supports the efforts of the Ludlow In Bloom volunteers financially with Community Project funding, and also provides practical help in the form of advice from Community Services Officer, Dick Harpur, and a range of horticultural

services, including watering and groundwork, that is undertaken by members of the Direct Labour Force.

It's not just about trying to impress the judges on their annual visit to the town — the Ludlow In Bloom committee meets regularly throughout the year, and helps to co-ordinate the efforts of a large team of volunteers as well as involving a wide range of local community organisations.

Involving children

Young children, for instance, have been involved in planting bulbs and flower-growing competitions, and another group of local volunteers, Ludlow Pride of Place, helps the overall effort by organising regular litterpicks.

The work to enhance Ludlow goes on all year round as Ludlow In Bloom provides and maintains beautifully planted tubs and hanging baskets throughout the town, and encourages local authorities, businesses and residents to take pride in the horticultural appearance of Ludlow.

Everyone's efforts are paying off – not only does the town look brighter and more



Christmas lights

How Health and Safety changed the face of our town's Christmas Lights display...

Planning for Ludlow's Christmas lights runs throughout the year and culminates with the switch-on ceremony at the end of November, which coincides with the Ludlow Medieval Fayre.

At the beginning of the year, Councillors and staff meet as a working group to begin planning the year's festive lights display. Recent developments in Health and Safety legislation have had an impact on Christmas lights across the country, and Ludlow's Town Councillors decided that the best way to comply with Health and Safety rules and provide festive cheer for Ludlow is to decorate the town centre with

motifs mounted on street lights, saving the strings of lights for smaller streets.

The first of these new motifs were hung in the Bull Ring in 2007. This year, new motifs were hung in Corve Street, Old Street, and Bull Ring. In future years, the motifs will be extended into other areas of the Town Centre.

As usual, colourful strings of lights hung by the Direct Labour Force adorn Quality Square, Castle Gardens, Church Street, and the Market Square. In the interest of the environment, Ludlow Town Council will, as funds allow, replace the current lights with low energy bulbs.

Pride of Place

A team of volunteers helps to keep the town tidy with regular litterpicks.

Ludlow Town Council works with the town's Pride of Place group, providing administrative and technical support, and a meeting place at the Buttercross.

What Pride of Place Does

"We target Litter Hotspots, important gateways to Ludlow, and prime areas such as Market Square and Events Square, which create a first impression for visitors," explains Rosanna Taylor-Smith, Chair of the Ludlow Price of Place group.

For special occasions and festivals the group makes sure that the town centre is clean and presentable. Litterpicks are run before Remembrance Day, Easter, the Ludlow Festival, the Ludlow Food & Drink Festival, the Medieval Fayre — and of course before the Ludlow in Bloom Judging Day.

Through publicity, the group promotes Pride of Place and its programme of work while explaining the concept of volunteer litter wardens and working to recruit new volunteers to the team.

"We also approach School Headteachers and senior college staff to engage the support of staff and students to help keep our town clean and tidy," Rosanna says. "We all need to be working together."

Businesses are involved through the Ludlow Chamber of Trade, which helped to get Pride of Place up and running, and encourages all local retailers to clean their frontages every day as a routine measure.

Litterbins are on the agenda too — if an additional bin could help keep an area tidy, we work with partners to get it installed.

We work closely with the District Council's Streetscene Officers to report graffiti, fly-posting, abandoned vehicles. And remember, £80 Fixed Penalty Notices can now be imposed for litter offences – we would rather lead by example!

Community grants

Does your organisation or group need a bit of financial help? Get in touch...

Ludlow Town Council actively supports the community of Ludlow in many different ways. The Council itself provides or contracts out services such as the market, cemetery, street lighting and amenity areas, but it also provides funding and other resources for community projects including Ludlow in Bloom, CCTV, Pride of Place, and the Ludlow Christmas Lights.

The Council also provides financial support through grants to local groups and initiatives including Ludlow Festival, Whitcliffe Common, Ludlow Youth Council, The Teme Weirs Trust, Citizens' Advice, and Ludlow Assembly Rooms.

In the early 1990s Town Councillors supported the establishment of the Ludlow Assembly Rooms as an arts and community venue, and the Council continues to offer Community Project Funding to the Ludlow Assembly Rooms. 'The Rooms' has become the leading rural arts, entertainment and community centre in the area, and is renowned for its diverse and stimulating programme, friendly atmosphere and accessibility to all.

The Assembly Rooms was built in the 1830s with £6,000 raised by public subscription. The 'Public Rooms' were opened in July 1840. During its long life the building has been the base for a shop, a cinema, a museum and a nightclub. Ludlow Town Council offers small one-off Project Support Grants to help local organisations based in, and directly benefiting, Ludlow. Contact the Buttercross to find out more.
