# R/184 PUBLIC OPEN SESSION (15 minutes)

Four members of the public was present.

A Resident addressed the meeting regarding SY8 Studios formerly Ludlow Maternity Hospital as reported that:

Ludlow league of friends has met with Ludlow Hospital management and staff and oppose the licencing application. Planning permission was granted in December 2022 and emphasis on small scale quiet developments. Assurances were given about no noise, no disturbance and 12 car parking spaces. The building is adjacent to a main clinical space housing 24 inpatient beds and 4 end of life care rooms. They have a 10 year lease and applied for an alcohol licence to be sold between 12-11pm 6 days per week and 12-10 pm on Sundays. NHS England policy prioritises the prevention of alcohol misuse therefore the application is inappropriate. People leaving events will have to walk though shared access and there is no parking.

A Resident addressed the meeting regarding SY8 Studios formerly Ludlow Maternity Hospital as reported that: there is no detail regarding the change of use and so it is difficult to comment on the application. There are also parking problems.

A Resident addressed the meeting regarding SY8 Studios formerly Ludlow Maternity Hospital as reported that: cars trying to park will cause problems. There is no room for extra cars. Hospital porters have turned cars away and issues with blocking in ambulances.

#### THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

The venue is situated on Ludlow Hospital grounds, which means there are over 20 in-patient beds and 4 end-of-life care beds in very close proximity to the venue. Permitting alcohol on the premises increases the likelihood of anti-social behavior, which would be unacceptable in such a sensitive environment.

#### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

The venue is situated on Ludlow Hospital grounds and has only 12 parking spaces. The rest of the car park is for the use of the hospital. The venue is

aiming to attract audiences / participants in excess of the limited on-site parking. The surrounding area is residential with a significant lack of on-street park-ing.

Events which attract many participants with nowhere to park will put public safety at risk by blocking access to the hospital for ambulances, or medical staff.

Whilst there is no A&E facility at Ludlow hospital, there is an in-patient ward and a minor injuries unit, which both create a higher-than-average need for ambulance access to assist patients, or the seriously injured, whose condition may deteriorate beyond the scope of the care available at Ludlow hospital.

The availability of alcohol on a hospital site in a direct contravention of the NHS aims to create a safe environment for recovering alcoholics and addicts.

#### THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

There would be nuisance caused to those convalescing on the ward, their visitors and family, and the end of life patients and their families would also experience unacceptable nuisance because of their proximity to the venue.

Introducing alcohol on the premises increases the likelihood of offensive noise and anti-social behaviour from people leaving the venue, which is unacceptable in such a sensitive environment.

Noisy public performances would also be an unacceptable source of nuisance for patients, visitors and those seeking a peaceful environment at the end of their life.
