DARK LANE TREE WORKS (ROAD CLOSURE)

<u>Update from Shropshire Council regarding Dark Lane tree works</u> <u>Road closure 11th-15th August</u>

Work was recommended by one of Tree Team's tree officers following an inspection of the route with SC Highways technician. All works approved by Tree Team.

We will be doing a mixture of works crown lifting, felling some Ash trees, felling some other dead trees and leaning trees i.e. elm and hawthorn, x5 Ash trees have had work on them before but not from us and they look a mess as they were butchered by a resident I presume, from Parys Road end will be topping anything to hedge/fence height but its all hedgerows and dead unmaintained trees.

Sandpits end where its growing over the footway will not be touched as that's where dark lane comes from, be removing any leaning small trees which if fall would be into houses and footway there will only be 1 tree that might be controversial and have sent Martin photos of it and he's happy, large Ash tree approx 150m up from Parys Road end but is growing and has lost branches in the past in gardens and was showing signs of Ash dieback disease I was going to send an email out within the next week or so saying this to yourselves and councillors but not in so much detail.

Darl lane has been left unmaintained for years and therefore people do things themselves and when we do work it becomes a shock but only going to benefit all other trees and wildlife after works. I will attach some photos of butchered trees leaning trees and dead elm

1. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

1.1 To note action being taken in line with Shropshire Council's Public Space Protection Order relating to dog fouling and control.

2. RECOMMENDATION

2.1 To approve that pavement stencils are used to remind dog owners to pick up their dog fouling in the following areas of Ludlow: Parys Road, Camp Lane, Henley Road, Old Street, Gravel Hill, Lower Galdeford, Temeside, Dodmore Lane, Greenacres, Dark Lane, Clee View, Sandpits Road, Corve Street.

3. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

3.1 We were made aware of this project via SALC: Shropshire Council - Dog Fouling Pavement Stencils:

Earlier this year Shropshire Council supplied dog fouling pavement stencils to Town and Parish Councils. They are now seeing some feedback – have the stencils been used and have they had an impact on reducing the amount of dog foul not being picked up? If you feel that you would benefit from having a pavement stencil, arrangements can be made for them to be delivered by the Dog Warden.

We contacted Shropshire Council for some free stencils (86cm X 58cm) and have purchased some chalk paint which is suitable for use on pavements as it is not permanent.

The Dog Warden passed on information that there have been very few enquiries/complaints for Ludlow in recent months. Parys Road and Old Street were mentioned as having dog foul issues/concerns in the past.

Other Town and Parish Councils have given positive feedback and have said they have seen an improvement in dog fouling having used the stencils.

An example of a stencil used in Bayston Hill is shown in the photograph.



4. **PUBLIC CONSULTATION**

4.1 It is important the stencils are used sporadically and not just blanket coverage so that people do not become blind to the message. There has been some social media promotion and an online survey for people to complete if they feel there is an area/ street of Ludlow where dog fouling is an issue.

Ludlow is rolling out a fresh initiative to tackle dog fouling — with the help of Shropshire Council's Dog Warden (and her four-legged assistant), we've welcomed new pavement stencils designed to remind and deter. These eye-catching markers will soon appear on Ludlow's streets as part of our mission to keep public spaces safe, welcoming, and walkable for everyone.

- Dog walkers must clean up after their pets
- Failing to do so could result in a fixed penalty notice
 Let's all do our bit to keep Ludlow beautiful. Bag it, bin it, and spread the word

4.2 The survey is a consultation tool that we can use throughout the year and particularly again in the autumn/ winter when dog fouling tends to increase on pavements and footpaths due to darker mornings and evenings

5. PUBLIC SPACE PROTECTION ORDERS (PSPO)

5.1 Shropshire Council introduced a PSPO for dog control in Shropshire on 1st June 2024.

The order states that dogs must be kept on a lead on the highway and dog walkers must clean up their dogs poo, unless the walker is exempt due to disability or the dog is exempt because it is a working dog.

The police, civil enforcement officers (traffic wardens) and Shropshire Council officers are able to impose the fines. Those that are caught not obeying the rules will get a £100 fixed penalty notice with the prospect of much higher fines and costs if the matter goes to court.

5.2 The rules

The County of Shropshire Dog Control Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) 2023 requires dog walkers to:

- Clean up the poo. Dog walkers must immediately clean up and remove any faeces which have been deposited by the dog.
- Disposing of the poo. Faeces must be disposed of by being bagged and taken away or put into a public litter or dog waste bin. This means no hanging poo bags on trees or tossing them into bushes.
- Dog walkers must comply with any request from any authorised officer of Shropshire Council, a police officer, or police community support officer to clean up and remove any dog faeces.

The PSPO also excludes dogs from specified areas:

 Dog exclusion zones including any enclosed public children's play area, playground or similar enclosed area. This includes play areas owned by parish and town councils, if signed at the entrances as a dog exclusion zone.

5.3 Dogs on leads

- Dogs must be kept on a lead no more than 1 metre in length on the highway.
- If instructed by an authorised person (see below), they must put their dog on a lead except where there is a reasonable excuse including the landowner's permission.

5.4 Enforcement

Fixed penalty notices under the PSPO can be handed out by a police constable, police community support officer (PCSO), any officer or person authorised by Shropshire Council, including civil enforcement officers (traffic wardens).

5.5 Exemptions

Some dog walkers are exempt from the rules:

- Registered blind people.
- People with disabilities with assistance dogs trained by a charity.
- Working dogs, including those being used for work in emergency search and rescue, herding or shepherding animals, law enforcement and the work of the armed forces. The exemption will only apply while the dog is working.

The PSPO recognises the following charities as providing assistance dogs:

- Hearing Dogs for Deaf People
- Dogs for the Disabled
- Support Dogs
- · Canine Partners for Independence
- Assistance Dogs UK
