





MAYOR'S WELCOME

Welcome to issue four. I hope you agree that the Buttercross Bulletin is a good way to keep in touch. The newsletter will help us achieve Quality Council Status, but more importantly it is a way of building a positive dialogue with the residents of Ludlow.

I'm delighted to tell you that Ludlow Town Council's refurbishment of key historic buildings and public areas is creating improvements at the Buttercross, Market and Cemetery (more details on p. 4). However, as are probably aware a large section of ceiling plaster recently crashed to the floor without warning at the Buttercross.

Luckily, no members of staff were in the building at the time, but further inspection has confirmed that all the Buttercross ceiling plaster needs attention. I would like to thank staff at Shropshire Council, who in our hour of need, responded rapidly and found the Town Council temporary accommodation at the Stable Block. Town Council staff moved from the Buttercross in mid November. The move has lead to other changes, namely a revised meeting schedule with new venues (please see p.7)

So with the immediate crisis managed, Councillors and staff are currently busy working on next year's budget, and a five year Town Plan for Ludlow (further details in a future issue), which will consider life in Ludlow from a variety of perspectives including tourism and youth, both of which are issues close to the heart of Town Council.

This year, Mayor of Ludlow, Martin Taylor-Smith switched on Ludlow's Christmas Lights. The Town Council has made environmentally beneficial changes to lighten up and brighten up the Town Centre including 1,300 new coloured LED lights and new festoon cable.

LED lamp post motifs adorn Corve Street, Old Street and the Bull Ring, and small fibre-optic Christmas Trees decorate shop windows in High Street and Corve Street, and a new 'Double Clef' banner hangs from The Buttercross. The Market Square Christmas tree is illuminated by white LED lights, and coloured strings of lights will glow in

Tower Street, High Street, Market Street, Church Street, and Quality Square. Ludlow Town Council funds the provision and installation of Ludlow's Christmas Lights financial support and donations from businesses and individuals are always very welcome.

Ludlow Town Council wishes you a happy Christmas and prosperous 2010.



Projects Updates

FRESH NEW LOOK FOR LUDLOW MARKET

Market Manager Chris Bayliss and members of Ludlow Town Council's Direct Labour Force, lead by Steve Gregory, worked incredibility hard to meet the challenge of putting up Ludlow's new Market in two days — and as promised, it was ready for the Wednesday Market.

The new market, agreed after consultation with traders, features an extended overhang to protect customers from the weather. Market Manager, Chris said, 'The new look market has been largely welcomed by traders and members of the public have said how good it looks.'

Town Clerk, Veronica Calderbank, who was responsible for overseeing all projects including the new market, said 'it is hoped that the new market will help economic viability and generate new interest in Ludlow.'

BUTTERCROSS

Ludlow Town Council is delighted to announce that work has commenced on the Buttercross. Mayor, Martin Taylor-Smith said 'We are delighted that work has now started on safeguarding one of the town's most important historical landmarks.' The recent collapse of ceiling plaster certainly suggests that the work is very timely.

PHASE ONE:

The successful contractor for phase one is local firm, Treasures. The works will include painting and restoration work at ground level including doors and the windows, which will be rebuilt and glazed with toughened glass. The Buttercross is used as part of the regular Markets on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. During the works, traders will be housed in temporary 'pop-up' market stalls to protect the traders and stock from the elements. There will also be a noticeable revamp of the Church Street / College Street facade.

PHASE TWO:

As soon as emergency measures to evacuate staff and equipment are completed, Town Council will be going out to tender on second phase, which will involve works to the cupola. The second phase is expected to start early in January 2010.




LUDLOW MAYFAIR

Following two successful meetings with Mr & Mrs Wynn, the emergency services, Shropshire Council and the Police, plans are moving ahead towards the next Mayfair. Everyone agreed that the town needed an Events Safety Advisory Group (SAG) which includes Mr & Mrs Wynn, representatives from Ludlow and Shropshire Councils, and the emergency services. Sergeant Graham Preece said, 'In the experience of this Division such groups result in far more robust and professional events

The first meeting was held on 12th November 2009. The first item on the agenda was to elect a chairman and Cllr J Aitken was elected unanimously. Following formal introductions, members allocated key tasks and actions such as, establishing terms of reference for the group, liaison between emergency services, and an accurate Mayfair 'footprint.' Mr Wynn said, 'I am happy to provide a new plan for the group showing where the rides will be next year, and look forward to working with everyone to carry on organising Mayfairs for the future.'

The next meeting of the Events Safety Advisory Group (SAG) has been scheduled for mid December 2009.
