

Project Updates

Ludlow Boxing Club

Ludlow Boxing Club is almost completed. The doors and windows are now in place and work to the interior has begun. The walls have been painted and the final push has begun.

Opening Event Saturday 18th January 2014 a day to say Thank You!

There are so many people to thank including local businesses, residents, organisations who have generously given time, materials, skills and donations to Ludlow Boxing Club.

Following the demolition of the unsafe hut, the construction of a sturdy metal framed and brick built boxing club with community room, changing rooms, toilet and kitchen facilities has been made possible through financial and in kind support of £50,000 from Shropshire Council; £10,000 from the Local Joint Committee: over £30,000 from South Shropshire Housing Association; £20,000 from Ludlow Town Council; and possibility most importantly over £50,000 of private donations and local business support.

Wheeler Road Recreation Area

In 1928, Wheeler Road Playing fields were donated by James Wheeler, to the community of Ludlow for the enjoyment of young people. The site is owned by Ludlow Town Council, who have created a range of facilities for young people including the skate park, MUGA and young children's play area.

Ludlow Amateur Boxing Club (LABC) supports Ludlow's young people and the community has supported LABC through their donations. The building will be leased to Ludlow Amateur Boxing Club by Ludlow Town Council. The Town Council donated £18,000 to create a car park.







@TheButtercross Museum & Heritage Centre Under Construction!

The Buttercross Museum & Heritage Centre is progressing well. The old plasterwork has been taking off and taken back to its original shell. The ceiling batons and rafters have been strengthened and reformed to allow a better structure to plaster onto. The timber frame for the internal walls have been constructed and all of the plumbing work and electrical points have been thread ready for the plaster boards to be applied.

By constructing the internal walls before the plasterwork has been applied to the ceiling this will avoid any movement and disturbance while it is left to dry properly and securely.

Ludlow Town Council is working with Ludlow Museum and Friends of Ludlow Museum to create a new space for some of the heritage based artefacts for



Ludlow. Alongside this technologies will be used to bring aspects of Ludlow's Heritage back to life that have been lost and forgotten, while providing exciting new experiences and information for all to see.

Completion is expected mid-2014









The Vision
