



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



#### **MAYOR'S WELCOME**

Ludlow Town Council has been very busy in the past year and we have seen a year of improvements to service and progress on many fronts.

Capital projects include the refurbishment of the market, improvements to the Cemetery; and consultations on the Linney enhancement. Our five year Town Development Plan is being worked up and consulted on. This will provide the basis for our future priorities.

An extensive programme of works to improve the Buttercross has commenced. Until last year the buildinghoused our offices, but falling ceiling plaster endangered staff, so the townclerk organised an emergency move to the Stable Block at Shropshire Council's site in Corve Street . Officers now enjoy the benefits of purpose-built facilities and recently the move was made permanent (more on p.4).

The Town Clerk has worked hard to improve our internal processes and we now have confidence in our accounts package. Shortly, our Council is expected to be awarded Quality Status.

I hope you'll agree that Ludlow Town Council has achieved a great s deal in the past year- and there is plenty more to come. As a Council, it is our aim to serve Ludlow well, and at the heart of that aim see you at the Annual Town Meeting on 19 May (see right)

Visiting Mayors and dignitaries from the whole of Shropshire attended the Mayor's Sunday Service at St Laurence's Church.




During the service the Town Council

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


#### **INCOME**

The Mayor and councillors, mindful of the current economic climate, felt it was important that they did not raise the precept, which is raised from council tax paid by local residents.

As you can see from the pie chart opposite, the precept is only one element in the Town Council's overall income. Other sources of income include Ludlow market, allocated grant funding, Henley Road Cemetery, and rent from properties. As a local authority, Ludlow Town Council finances are a matter of public record. A copy of the annual accounts will be available at the Annual Town Meeting on 19th May (more details on page 2).

#### **EXPENDITURE**

In 2010/11, the Council will deliver projects at Henley Road Cemetery, Buttercross, the Linney and Castle Gardens. Projects expenditure will be partially met by grants from outside bodies. The remainder financed by allocated funds in the Council's capital reserves.

Ludlow Town Council also provides services including the maintenance of street lighting, the administration and maintenance of Henley Road Cemetery; management of Ludlow Market, street furniture such as bins, benches and bus shelters, maintenance of recreation areas including Wheeler Road Park, The Linney, St Laurence's Garden of Rest and Castle Garden – see expenditure chart opposite for a more detailed breakdown.

## **LUDLOW TOWN PLAN 2010 – 2015 CONSULTATION**

Having first analysed the previous Town Plan 2004-2009, and assessed the scope and values of a plan for Ludlow from 2010-2015, town councillors led by working group chairman Cllr Susan McCormack, held a series of meetings with local organisations, and residents to discuss the future development of Ludlow. Cllrs have received a wide range of ideas, which will feed into the core strategies of the Town Plan.

The first public consultation event, held in a 'pop-up' stall on Ludlow, provided an especially rich vein of feedback, which has encouraged councillors use this more informal method of consultation in future.

Comments from residents indicate that they 'Welcome Town Council driving a plan'. The primary areas of concern seem to be facilities for young people, tourism and signage; other concerns include traffic, parking and policing.

#### LINNEY RIVERSIDE PARK CONSULTATION



Ludlow Town Council would like to thank everyone who took part in the Linney Riverside questionnaire – and reserve special thanks for the children of Ludlow School, Ludlow Junior School, St Laurence's School, and 'Busy Bodies' Nursery who enthusiastically gave their expert opinions on play equipment.

The children's preference for the Wicksteed scheme (pictured) formed the basis for our Playbuilder grant application, which if successful will secure this part of the project. We now expect to

hear whether or not the application has been successful in mid June, so although it may appear that progress is slow, nothing can happen on site until we know the funds are in place.

One clear preference has emerged from the initial analysis of the resident's feedback. Residents share Ludlow Town Council's concern to protect the flood plain eco-system. Ludlow Town Council is currently working with experts from Shropshire Council Environmental Maintenance, the Environment Agency Development and Control team, and contractors to achieve our goals and protect our investment in recreational facilities whilst maintaining the area's capacity and important function as a flood plain.

## PERMANENT MOVE TO THE STABLE BLOCK

It's official, Ludlow Town Council is now based at the Stone House site in Corve Street! The purpose built offices include a ramp entrance to the side of the building, a meeting room and parking.

We don't want to let this move affect our sense of connection with the heart of Ludlow, so we are in the process of setting up a Shropshire Council dog 'poop scoop' bag distribution centre in partnership with the Visitor Information Centre (VIC) 01584 875 053, opposite the market. You will also be able to fill in a form to report faulty street lights.



#### **TOWN CLERK'S UPDATE**

Ludlow Town Council has come a long way in a year. In 2009/10, the Council's projects resulted in improvements to the drainage at Henley Road Cemetery, the complete replacement of Ludlow Market, and the completion of phase one of the Buttercross.

The consultation has taken place and it is hoped that planned works will begin later this year. Developments continue and the Town Council will consult on the Castle Gardens project, as well as continuing with improvements to the Buttercross and the development of the new Cemetery area.

### PROJECTS UPDATE HENLEY ROAD CEMETERY

#### **Cemetery Training**

Town Council officers, funeral directors and memorial masons working at the cemetery have recently completed an extensive training programme, which was initiated to ensure that high standards are maintained. The course was well attend and twenty certificates were issued.

#### **Cemetery Toilets**

Following advice from Shropshire Council Access Officer facilities will be unisex with a designated accessible toilet. Work is expected to begin soon. To create a disabled access and to refurbish the toilets.

#### **Chapel Doors**


Work to improve the chapel doors will commence soon.

## FREE HOME FIRE RISK ASSESSMENT INCLUDING SMOKE ALARMS







Shropshire Fire and Rescue Service believe that they can play an important role in advising members of the public about the potential dangers they may have in their homes. With the busy lives that people lead today, at times little attention is paid to safety in the home, but unfortunately statistics show that it is often those neglected safety aspects that result in the majority of fires that occur within the household. Our purpose is not to judge the lifestyle of people, but to ensure people are aware of the hazards and that people can make the necessary changes thus preventing a fire starting.

As part of the FREE Home Fire Risk Assessment we will test your smoke alarms ensuring they work and are located in the right place. We recommend one per level as a minimum placed in the hall and on the landing area. For those in unprotected properties we will fit one alarm per level for free.

The Home Fire Risk Assessment will also entail discussing having a Fire Escape plan, which is crucial for all to have. If you would like to book a safety check call 01743 260298 and leave your details on our dedicated line and your details will be passed to your local fire crew and they will call you to arrange a suitable time to visit. ### NIP GARDEN CRIME IN THE BUD Download a leaflet www.westmercia.police.uk



West Mercia Police are urging local householders to help "weed out" garden crime by reviewing and improving their garden and shed security. Even though Ludlow has a relatively low-crime area. Even so, around 1,500 shed burglaries are reported every year across the whole West Mercia region. Many of these incidents could be avoided with a little more thought given to security and crime prevention. Many people leave valuable equipment in gardens and unsecured sheds, providing easy pickings for opportunist thieves. PC Tim Weaver, Shropshire's Crime Prevention Manager, said: "While many people take steps to protect their homes and the property inside them, they often leave valuable equipment such as power tools, mowers, garden tools and bikes in unsecured sheds in their gardens or allotments."

**Physical security of sheds**: Fitted good quality, close-shackle padlocks; windows should be fitted with a grille or mesh; inexpensive battery-powered shed alarms can be bought from hardware shops and DIY stores.

**Security of property inside sheds**: Expensive items such as bicycles, power tools, mowers, garden tools and golf clubs should preferably not be stored in sheds. If there is no alternative, they should be secured to a strong anchor within the shed, e.g. metal rings fixed to concrete on the shed floor. Large items should be chained together – it is more difficult for a thief to carry one large heavy lot of items.

**Defensible planting:** Defensible planting (prickly plants) is nature's own way of deterring burglars and increasing the security of your home and garden, and complementing other security measures to protect perimeters, windows and drainpipes. Boundaries and lighting: Boundary fences, gates and walls should be kept in good repair as they can prevent thieves from getting to the back and sides of a property.

## **GREAT NEWS FOR BUDDING BOXERS**

Ludlow Amateur Boxing Club is planning to update facilities to help ensure the continuation of this much valued resource to the local community.



Ludlow Amateur Boxing Club (ABC) was originally set up and run by the late John Morris, who was the uncle of Duncan Morris, who along with PC Tony Sewell, Stuart Richards and Steve Davies revived the club in October 2007.

As Duncan explains, "It all started again after my son, Craig Morris and his friend Jamie Wilson, wanted to start boxing.'

Craig is now a Midlands champion and has reached the semifinals of the ABA and the CYP Championships. Unfortunately, the wooden hut currently occupied by the boxing club is now described as 'beyond repair.' So the club are seeking external funding for a new building on the same site. The proposed new timber framed building will accommodate a large area for training, unisex accessible toilet facilities, storage and changing room. Sound proofing will be installed throughout the building to reduce noise and improve the energy efficiency of the building. There is also provision for six parking spaces.

Ludlow Town Council has provided funding to get the project started with the assistance of John Bryan local surveyor, who donated his time drawing up plans free of charge to the club.

Colin Richards, Historic Environment Manager, John Harrison and Nick Taylor of Shropshire Council also deserve thanks for their contribution.
