### Looking to the Future

Ludlow Town Council has declared a Climate Emergency with the objective of being carbon neutral by 2030.

The Town Council's very significant step will, in due course, impact on every local service.

As a first tier local government authority with the closest connection to the local community, young and old must be considered in the Council's decision making process.

Service provision is an important role for the Town Council, local services include Ludlow market, burials and grounds maintenance at Henley Road Cemetery, Ludlow Museum at the Buttercross, public toilets, The Linney Riverside Park, Wheeler Road Recreation area and Skate Park, and other local play areas.

In June this year, a bus shelter was installed in Corve Street to protect travellers from the elements and make their journey more comfortable; and the public toilets at the Linney Riverside Park were refurbished, giving peace of mind to many, and helping families to enjoy their day out.

Supporting positive experiences is part of the role of the Town Council, as is actively celebrating good citizenship in the community.

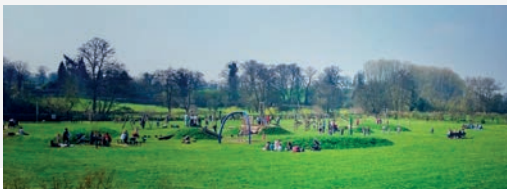

## Corve Street Bus Shelter

Ludlow Town Council put a lot of research

into finding a shelter that would meet the needs of



the users and be suitable for the site. Mayor of Ludlow, Cllr Gill said, 'We felt that regular users of public transport would be well served by the new shelter.'

## New Linney Toilets

Ludlow Town Council are delighted that contractor J Harper & Sons Ltd, Leominster have completed the project by the end of June as agreed.

The improved facilities include male, female, disability accessible toilets, and a baby changing unit.



## Town Walls Update

Ludlow Town Council has received a loan from the Public Works Loan Board to progress the second stage of works.

It was secured at 2.1% interest and the annual repayments will be £1,989.00. We budgeted for this expenditure and wish to reassure residents that the precept won't increase due to the loan repayments.

The Morton Partnership have been appointed as Lead Consultant and Structural Engineer. An ecological survey and historic environment assessment of the 72m length of Ludlow Town Walls will inform the next stages, which will be more invasive investigations including cores through the walls, and archaeological work.

## Climate Emergency

Ludlow Town Council has declared a Climate Emergency with the aim of becoming a carbon neutral organisation by 2030. It commits to identifying ways in which it can support this objective and to explore, with the community, the development of a climate change strategy, and to consider establishing a Climate Action Partnership.

A food and drink walk of between 8 - 10 miles. This year it starts and finishes at the Shropshire Hills Discovery Centre in Craven Arms.

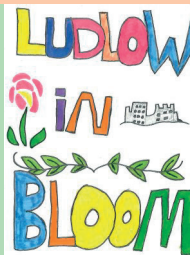
