PRECEPT

Ludlow Town Council resolved to make a 5.2% precept increase for 2014/15.

The increase in Band D property Council Tax bill is 9 pence per week.



The Town Council continues to provide the following services to local residents which includes the Market, Henley Road Cemetery, Public Toilets, Play Areas at Wheeler Road, the Linney, Houseman Crescent and Weyman Road. Allotment provision and Christmas lights also fall under the umbrella of the Town Council. Ongoing projects include the Buttercross Interpretation Centre and the Henley Road Cemetery.



WWI Commemorations

2014 marks 100 years since the start of WWI. During 2014-2018 commemorations have been arranged throughout the country.

With assistance from the Local Joint Committee, the Town Council is in the process of refurbishing 24 boards naming all those who served in WWI and those who fell during this period. The boards will be exhibited at the Guildhall.

Henley Road Cemetery, also commemorates 100 years since opening and details of those who were buried 1914 will appear shortly at www.ludlow.gov.uk in an interactive display of life in Ludlow in 1914. This project covers weather events, the Ludlow Union Workhouse, professional people in Ludlow and military personnel who served and died.

Four days after war was declared the Kings Shropshire Light Infantry paraded through Ludlow, (photograph on the front page) many on horseback. It is anticipated that a smaller horse parade will take place in 2015.

Wheeler Road Boxing Club & Community Centre is a collaborative project between Ludlow Town Council, Ludlow Amateur Boxing Club, Shropshire Council and Shropshire Housing Association. This project would not have been possible without the generosity of local companies gifting materials and many local residents and trades people volunteering their skills and time. Thanks to all those involved.



1. The project started on the 16th December 2011 when the old, dilapidated building was demolished to make way for a new, leak free home for the Ludlow Amateur Boxing Club and as a community room for local residents.



In 2012 the project, managed by the Town Clerk took shape. Colin Richards became the Site Manager, CDM and HSE works were undertaken before the build could begin.

The Groundbreaking Ceremony took place on 27th September 2012.



Buttercross Heritage Interpretation Centre



Market Town Revitalisation Programme Funding of £120,000 from Shropshire Council was granted on 27 August 2013.

The works to refurbish the grade I listed building on English Heritage's At Risk Register began immediately.

The internal timber frame walls have been constructed ready for new plumbing and electrical works. The existing poorly adhered plaster work was removed and lathes respaced and rafters strengthened to create a more robust structure

for the new plaster. It is estimated that plastering the ceiling will take up to 8 weeks to complete.

Remedial work was needed to the steps leading to the Buttercross covered market area the work was completed by Stuart Preece and Sons in March 2014.

Ludlow Town Council are currently rebidding for money from Shropshire Council to complete the refurbishment work.

Support for Ludlow Museum

The outgoing High Sherriff of Shropshire, Diane Flint visited the Ludlow Museum, along with the Mayor Cllr Jim to see some of the exhibits which could be sharing space when the Buttercross Heritage Interpretation Centre has been completed.

Restoration of the steps



After years of good service the stone steps to the front of the Buttercross needed realignment and repair. Work was carried out by Stuart Preece & Sons and the steps were back in use in March.

Buttercross Clock

The Buttercross Clock has been a little erratic in its timekeeping recently.

The Town Council knows that the Buttercross clock is important to the town and will work with Smith of Derby to resolve the ongoing issues.

Linney Riverside Park - Project

November 2013 South Shropshire Youth Forum, in collaboration with the Friends of the Linney Riverside Park and the Town Council, constructed a living willow structure, at the Linney Riverside Park, in the shape of a Viking longship. The project involved youngsters and residents from the community who learnt new skills and as the willow will periodically require re-weaving be an ongoing project. Sadly within a week of completion the structure had been vandalised. Repairs took place during February half-term. Ludlow Town Council has received £2,335 as the final stage of Spaces for Sports Skate Park funding.

The three year funding has facilitated skateboard coaching sessions at the Youth Festival and other activities at Wheeler Road.

The Town Council will work in partnership with SSYF and Shropshire Council to provide BMX and scooter sessions, bike maintenance and skatepark awareness, demonstration coaching at the Marches Youth Festival, Street Art and photography & video exhibition.

Focus in the Community The Rockspring Centre, Sandford Road, Ludlow

Rockspring - Computer Sessions

"Drop in" computer sessions are available at the Rockspring Centre on Tuesday and Thursday mornings taught by Adrian Cobley. The sessions are two hours duration, although can be flexible. Up to five spaces are available. The oldest computer user is over 80 and the youngest users are in their 20s.

Computer skills taught include; word processing, email and surfing the web. Some students are referred by Job Centre plus to improve their skills, whilst others come for one-to-one training in specific applications such as spreadsheets. Future training offered includes digital imaging and Photoshop.

Additional "drop in" computer sessions taught by Adrian Cobley are available at the Craven Arms Community Centre Wednesday morning.
