**LTC comments:** The proposed works are part of a complete redesign and replanting of the garden to be supervised by professional landscapers and the owners are clearly keen to do a careful job. The trees proposed for removal, although visible from the public footpath and overlooked from Whitcliffe, have no intrinsic aesthetic value and their removal is a sensible part of the overall plan.

The 4 yew trees are rooted in the top of the town wall. The trees are cantilevered over the public footpath and, at about 11 metres tall, exert heavy mechanical pressures on the wall in windy weather with the risk of damage to both the wall and the public. Their complete removal would involve substantial repair work on the wall either in the short term if the stumps were removed or in the long term if the stumps were left to rot. The proposal to retain the trees as a hedge or topiary is therefore a sensible one which will both remove some of the dangers arising from mechanical stress on the wall and avoid the expense of its repair.

The three horse chestnuts are proposed for pollarding at 10 metres. These trees are a prominent feature of the view from a section Castle Walks and a potential risk to users of the footpath. As the applicant's notes say, all three have rotten cavities from previous loss of branches or cutting. Pollarding at 10 metres will create new points of decay in a species which is particularly vulnerable to failure from disease. In our opinion these three trees would be better removed completely before the garden is reconstructed and replaced by a decorative species. This would have the advantage of removing a long-term hazard over the footpath whilst also opening up a view from this section of Castle Walks to the river.
