R/81 PUBLIC OPEN SESSION (15 minutes)

Cllr Taylor-Smith informed members that the minutes from Ludlow Area Planning Liaison Group are not public, although the minutes of Ludlow Area Conservation Area Advisory Committee are a matter of public record and suitable for inclusion on the agenda.

<u>RESOLVED</u> (unanimous) RJ/SMc

(i) That the minutes of the meeting of the **REPRESENTATIONAL COMMITTEE** held on **10th JANUARY 2011** with amended apologies were approved and signed as a correct record.

(ii) Members make further comments connected to Ludlow Hospital application with reference to the Save a Ludlow Town Surgery campaign as detailed below.

Members feel that saving Ludlow's hospital facilities is the primary objective and in general terms the new hospital would offer a unified and improved service. They also believed that funding for a new hospital had been dependent on inclusion of surgeries onsite.

The new location would bring the doctor's surgery facilities closer to residents from the Rockspring & Galllows Bank Ward, so there would probably be as many winners as there were losers regarding the location. Members believed that bus timetables would be amended to provide a more effective service.

Members expressed concerns that an onsite pharmacy might have an unfair advantage because of the convenience factor, although a town pharmacy already offered a door to door service for repeat prescriptions which was unlikely to be replicated at a hospital pharmacy.

Members agreed that the best course of action was to attend the public meeting.

R/83 LUDLOW AREA PLANNING LIASION GROUP

Members were informed by Dyanne Humphries that further minutes from the group would be confidential because they would be dealing with the pre-application stage of potential planning applications and the minutes would not be made public.

The Town Council's Representative at the Liaison Group meeting would have the option to invite the developer to address Representational Committee or Full Council.

Members agreed that the pre-application process was new and untested and required review after a period of three months. Members suggested that the first applications to go through the process should be made available to Representational Committee once they had been through the pre-application process and were no longer confidential.

LTC comments: From the inspection of Ludlow Council's Tree Warden, members have been advised that the mature oak is one of many in the area which give it a cohesive landscape character. As the area around it is not fenced although it is private property the owner must be particularly careful that members of the public (who can walk without hindrance beneath the tree) are not likely to suffer injury from falling branches. It is therefore appropriate that the owner should have dead wood cleared by a competent tree surgeon. There is also an area of significant rot in one major branch and a safety report by a competent arborist would be sensible.

Members agreed to invite Ludlow Town Council Tree warden, Peter Norman to give a briefing on Conservation Area and TPO procedures at the next Council Meeting
